GETTING THERE: Interstate 15 to Parowan (exits 75 or 78) and drive 13 miles to Brian Head. Delta/SkyWest Airlines serve nearby Cedar City

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- SERVICES:** Available are professional ski and snowboard tuning, waxing, and repairs, and a large supply of replacement parts for most major brands - at Navajo Lodge Learning Center and Giant Steps Lodge.
- OVERNIGHT STORAGE:** Available for all ski rentals and on an as-available basis otherwise
- SNOW TUBING:** Six lanes are serviced by a surface lift at Navajo Mountain
- BACKCOUNTRY:** Days after a storm, expert level skiers can easily push Brian Head's vertical up to 1,548 feet with a short boot-pack to the steep fields and bowls on Brian Head Peak above the Resort's lifts. A "spotter car" can easily return powder enthusiasts to the lift network. (weather dependent)
- GLADED TRAILS:** Tree skiing and boarding is available off many runs on both Giant Steps and Navajo Mountains
- SKI & BOARD SCHOOL:** Famous for teaching children and adults how to ski, guaranteed, the Resort's Navajo Lodge Learning Center features one of the nation's best learn-to-ski environments, with an entire mountain dedicated to beginners. Packages are available for ages 3 and up.
- FAMILY FRIENDLY:** Brian Head's multiple "family" honors include "Top Family Getaway for Family Travelers" award from The Family Travel Forum.
- LICENSED CHILD CARE:** For children 6 weeks to 3 years old, on-mountain, state licensed daycare is offered daily from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for \$13 per hour or \$79 for the day (2 hour minimum).
- ADAPTIVE PROGRAM:** Traditional alpine skiing and snowboard packages for cognitive and developmental disabilities and visual impairment are offered, as are three-track and four-track packages for individuals with limited leg mobility or amputations. In addition, bi-ski and mono-ski packages are offered for individuals with limited leg mobility or paralysis. All packages include an all-day lift ticket, equipment rental, and a 2 hour lesson. All adaptive skiers and snowboarders who need, and are accompanied by, an assistant will receive a free "Disabled Assistance Pass" for their assistant with the purchase of a regular lift ticket. This includes regular mountain use as well as adaptive lessons. Reservations for an adaptive lesson are required 24 hours in advance, to ensure that a specially trained adaptive instructor is available.
